Warrington Development Plan

Sadly, I feel you are over-reaching yourselves with the current development plan for Warrington and that aspects of it are not sound.

Thirty years ago we moved to Warrington [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] Since then, in the development between Bridge Lane Appleton and Stretton, over 1000 homes have been built. That would mean over 2000 more cars on the roads.

The only additional infrastructure made available for all that desert of houses was an hourly bus service in workaday hours and two post boxes, one of which was unrecognisable, as such, being a brick construct with the post box on the unseen side of it.

For more than twenty of those recent years I have avoided driving to Warrington town centre on the A49 because of the constant congestion on it, in both directions.

How ever will the further 1000 homes currently granted planning permission in south Warrington affect Warrington's roads! That is a matter for serious concern, never mind considering the further 5000 houses further down the plan! No additional infrastructure seems to have been considered. We'll be mortally grid-locked!

Sadly, I repeat that your development plan for Warrington does not seem to be sound.
