I would like to object to the Local Plan based on a number of issues:

- The figures in which the growth has been based are calculated using outdated data
- The proposed commercial premises are going to destroy a large swathe of green space and is unnecessary. Is there even the slightest demand for this kind of space?
- The south of Warrington will turn into an urban sprawl of one housing estate after another and destroy any character the area has
- The current traffic levels on a good day are just about the limit of the roads but should the slightest incident happen it can't cope. If the incident is more serious then it's gridlock for hours. This is a frequent occurrence
- There are some parts of the local road infrastructure which cannot cope now, cannot be changed and yet you're going to add to the traffic. Public transport is not an option for the area, it's not good enough and too expensive.
- Warrington already has worst record in the country for air pollution, we should be doing something about this and not making it worse.
- This is unnecessary destruction of green belt land when there is brownfield land that could be used first and for smaller developments which are more appropriate for the area.

Please consider the long term viability of south Warrington as more than just a large housing estate and commercial units
