Is in a green belt area that should be preserved, this is a very quiet area that does not need disturbing and poses a number of issues including the use of Agricultural land.

In 1995 MAFF (now DEFRA) surveyed the land at Thelwall Heys

and stated that 68% of it was top quality Grade 1&2 and 31% of it Grade

3a. This compares to 15% of Grades

1&2 in Cheshire and 20% across England.

In other words Thelwall Heys is top quality agricultural land which with global warming etc should be protected. Surely you have been listening to Cop26!!!!!

## Greenbelt.
