Having studied the revised Local Plan and attending a consultation, I would like to submit my Representation.

I am sure there is no need for the scale of green belt release in South Warrington, which will destroy the character of our villages, a great asset to the town. Brown field sites should take priority.

With regard to the proposed release of greenbelt land for building off Rush Green Road, Lynton, I would like to point out that along the West boundary of this land is a Spring Water Stream the source of which is many natural springs at Waterness Farm, 61 Canal Bank. This stream is vital for the wild life that rely on it, and also the wild life who make their home in it, so it would be a disaster if it was polluted or damaged. A record of the wild life has been made with RECORD at CHESTER ZOO and this can be viewed on line. Frogs Newts Toads and

Fresh water shrimps live in the stream  
and foxes, badgers, pheasants, hedge  
hogs and many birds drink from it.

The roads in Hygum and Statham  
are very busy and unfit to take the  
extra cars that will result from the  
house building proposed. 200 houses may  
well mean another 400 cars coming and  
going on Rush Green Road. Cars often  
mount the pavement to avoid buses  
and lorries on the opposite side. We  
hear that a lady was hit by a wing  
mirror and suffered a broken elbow.

Building on the scale proposed  
on the green belt south of Warrington  
will destroy the character of the  
villages, and with this in mind I say  
NO to any unnecessary building.  
Once the Council have gobbled up all  
the green spaces they are lost for ever.
