I write to register my objection and concern regarding the proposals to build on greenbelt in the south of Warrington.

Nor only is building on greenbelt against all that we have know to be precious about this area but also with current crisis on global warming and climate, we need all that nature can give us to keep out air pure and healthy for this and future generations. Building a couple of trees for every driveway built will not balance things out as some would believe. I am also strongly objecting on the basis that our local infrastructure is currently at breaking point and can't cope with the demands it faces today, so adding more homes and cars will only add to the burden. Roads, drainage and health care need an overhaul. At least ONE other cantilever type bridge over the Ship Canal must be looked at BEFORE any more housing is built.

How does that make sense, let alone, affordable ??
