Hello

I am writing to strongly object to the local plan as it currently stands -

The current infrastructure is grossly inadequate and the proposal to create a new exit for Stretton Road onto London Road, simply moves the problem a little further down the road which is no solution at all. Air quality is already poor and this plan will increase the problem rather than alleviate it. A plan also needs to be created as soon as possible to update/replace the three swing bridges serving the area.

The justification on the predicted growth in the town has not been made or published. Only large houses are being built with a few affordable houses. In recent developments there are no or very few properties e.g. Bungalows for elderly people who wish to stay in the area but downsize.

The location of a new primary school is not quite clear but my understanding is that it will be close to Stretton Road which will further add to the congestion along that stretch. I have not seen any justification for a new school. Currently numbers in reception are lower than usual in the area and Grappenhall Heys is due to double in size at some point.

I do not believe that all brown field sites in the town have been fully used or are going to be. Once our farms and green belt have been built on we will never get them back and they will be lost forever. Development near to the Grappenhall Walled Garden is very close to the existing pathway with no land left for the planting of trees and bushes which will be very detrimental to our health and well being and also wild life in the area.
