It takes a relatively small traffic jam on the motorway network, usually around the m6, Thelwall Viaduct, for warrington to grind to a halt. Circumstances such as these cannot be planned for or managed. The effect on air pollution is huge. What effect building so many houses will have on day to day lives I cannot imagine. I try to use my bicycle when venturing into town from Appleton but take my life in my hands every time. Cycle lanes end abruptly leaving no option but to join in with the traffic or use the pavement. Infrastructure such as this must improve before construction takes place. Where are the plans for schools, surgeries, hospitals etc etc to cater for new residents let alone all those of us already living here and struggling to get the services we need?
