Motorists, Residents and Businesses are advised that major works to reconstruct PEPPER STREET, Lymm, are due to Start soon.

Extents: Between Rectory Lane and Grove Rise.

Stage 1. Open up the access on LONGBUTT LANE (on to Scholars

Green Lane) from 17 June 2024.

Duration: Up to 2 weeks.

Working Hours: 8:30am and 5:00pm Monday to Friday.

Stage 2: PEPPER STREET

Road Closed: Pepper Street will be closed between 7:00pm and 1:00am

Monday to Friday (Saturday morning).

When: Week commencing 24 June

Works: Set up site, excavate existing road, and reconstruct the road to tarmac level.

Duration: Up to 5 weeks to complete.

Access: During this period Pepper Street will be fully open to traffic outside the working times.

Stage 3: PEPPER STREET

Road Closed: Pepper Street will be fully Closed to through traffic every day and overnight (24 hours / 7 days per week).

When: Scheduled to start from 29 July 2024 for approximately 12 weeks (until completion of works).

Works: Paving Works to Road.

Access: Residents directly affected by the 24/7 closure of Pepper Street will receive a separate letter concerning access during the scheme

and alternative parking arrangements when the road is closed for an extended period for the laying of the setts.

Alternative Route: Additional information and updates during the scheme, including the signed diversion route, will be available at

Pedestrian Access: Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times during the works.

Vehicular Access: Vehicular access will be under the control of the contractor as directed on site.

Vehicles Blocking Works: Vehicles parked on the road or footway obstructing the works may be removed.

Car Park: Works will start at Grove Rise side to enable access to the car park for as long as possible. When work affects the access to the

car park, access will be available from Grove Rise side.

Safety On Site: Cones, barriers and signs are there for a reason - to protect our workers from danger and to keep the public safe. We urge drivers

to pay close attention to safety when driving near roadworks.
